

FSA FARM LOANS WILL MEET NEED

All Jackson county farmers expecting to finance operating goods for this year's crops through the Farm Security administration are urged to file their applications as soon as possible to avoid the usual spring rush and prevent delay in their farming operations, advises Eugene Hampton, county FSA supervisor, Fluhrer building, Medford.

Sufficient funds are available in

the county to meet all current needs of farmers who can qualify for rehabilitation or cooperative loans under the Farm Security program and are unable to secure sufficient credit from other sources. Loans can be made for livestock, farm equipment, seed, feed and similar operating goods, usually for a period of five years with interest at five per cent.

Eligibility for a loan requires that the farmer be located on a unit that will provide a livelihood for his family and that he agree to cooperate with the supervisor in working out farm and home plans that will insure a balanced crop and livestock program and place the farm on a business-like basis.

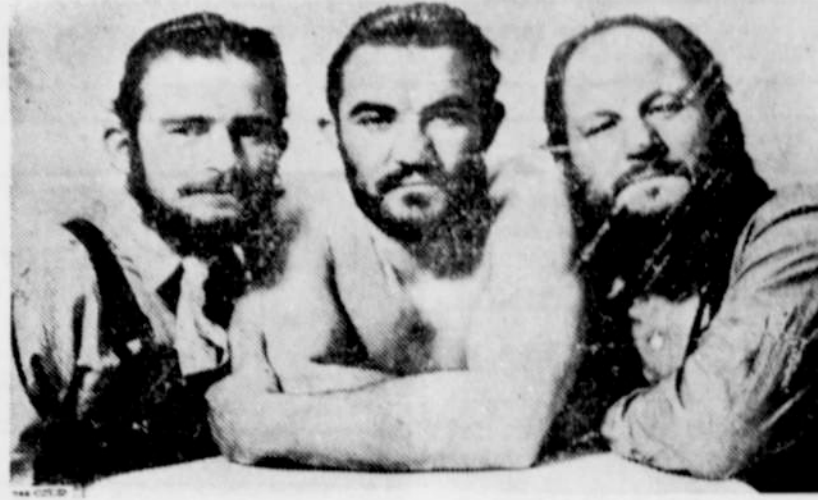

Cooperative loans are made where several farmers can economically use the services of heavy farm equipment, purebred sires or similar facilities. If farm debts are beyond capacity of the operator to pay, every effort is made to bring about a satisfactory adjustment between debtor and creditor before the loan is made.

County FSA offices in the Fluhrer building, Medford, are open from 8:30 a. m. to 12 noon and 1 p. m. to 4:30 p. m. except on Saturdays and Sundays, to receive applications.
