

# New Station Is \$10,000 Investment

## SHELL UNIT IS FIRST OF TYPE IN ALL OREGON

ASHLAND'S newest business improvement, a new and ultra-modern service station, will be opened for business Saturday, May 20, with Lou Rogers as manager, assisted by Bud Gandee and Carl Harris. The station represents a total investment of about \$10,000 on the part of J. D. Mars, local business man, owner of the lots at the corner of East Main street and Siskiyou boulevard where the new building has just been completed.

Under 10-year lease to the Shell Oil company, the station will replace the one operated at the corner of East Main and Second streets now by Rogers, and will bring the newest in facilities and equipment to this city.

The new station, of modern lines and compact arrangement, includes a full concrete apron and yard, grease room with new safety type hoist, office, rest rooms and computing pump island. The station occupies a corner vacant for several years, and fills out the business picture of this section.

The concrete station was erected by the Teller Construction company of Portland, which hired all local labor and employed local subcontractors for the job, with all materials being purchased locally except structural steel.
