Secretary of Agriculture Wallace says that sugar beet acreage in Oregon could be increased 14,-000 acres and in Washington 10,-000 acres. On the Owyhee project (there is a factory at Nyssa) the allotment for 1939 is 16,322 acres. The irrigable area of the project will be 100,000 acres and with the adjoining Vale project, brings the total to 130,000 acres, "which could well support two additional factories with an initial development of 7000 acres each, or 14,-000 acres." On Yakima project, there is a factory at Toppenish with an allotment of 14,310 acres for 1939. "Success of the Yakima project," says Wallace, "warrants further expansion of the area which could well support a second factory with an initial allotment of 10,000 acres."


