ARE THE ALLIES SACRIFICING WARSAW?

With desperate Poles holding out in Warsaw against great odds, a new note of heroism for a "lost" cause is being written in history of the present European war.

Sworn to defend Poland during such a time, neither England nor France have made one definite effort to help directly. All "aid" has been in a slow, methodical attack on the western side of Germany, where it might occupy nazi military strength but is hundreds of miles removed from the scene of acute need at Warsaw.

Most observers, cognizant of England and France's pledges to Poland, are wondering why some definite help—or at least gestures to that end—has not been given the prostrate country and, particularly the capital under siege for several weeks.

It does appear that the allies might have sent a few planes to harry and strafe the invading German forces or in some manner break through to the Poles.

But then, perhaps, we over here should not be too critical of allied technique and strategy. After all it is their war and we are, supposedly, trying to stay out of it, aren't we? That our own conception of neutrality permits us to kibitz from a safe distance does not of necessity justify our criticisms.

PRESENT NEUTRALITY IS COURSE OF DANGER!

Objection to revision of the neutrality law and substitution of cash and carry provisions seems to be based on fear of consequences resulting from sale of death-dealing equipment to belligerents.

As a matter of fact, the present law permits sale of about 90 per cent of the products and materials that belligerent nations wish to buy from us, and also permits the transportation of these in American ships through war zones to belligerent ports. Many of the articles now permitted to be sold and shipped to nations at war are on contraband lists and invite the sinking of American ships carrying such items to enemy ports.

The present enactment also permits the lending of American millions to warring nations, a practice which influenced this country in "protecting" investments during the last world war.

The proposed neutrality revision, as asked by President Roosevelt, would require cash purchase of all materials by belligerents and transportation from American shores in their own ships. No American boats would be permitted to carry munitions or enter war zones. Loans to other nations would be made by private bankers only at their own risk, with no obligation by this government to protect such investments.

Neutrality revision would strengthen our resistance to entry into war by sidestepping incidents which provoke a desire for war on our part. The present loosely drawn act with its arms embargo is less likely to keep us out of war than revision which would give greater security to our neutrality and, at the same time, aid our labor and build up our machinery of preparedness.

Most objection to revision is based on ignorance of the facts involved and is the conclusion suggested by misleading catch-phrases which obscure the issue.

CARELESS HUNTERS

With deer hunting season now open, the Klamath woods are crowded with sportsmen in search of a buck. So far the deer seem to be plentiful and hunters throughout this region are meeting with success.

The Klamath country is undoubtedly one of the best hunting regions remaining in the west and those men who enjoy the sport of stalking a deer should appreciate the privileges which are offered them here.

Deer hunters, however, should remember that they are playing a dangerous game and every precaution should be taken to safeguard their fellow hunters and the forests of the hunting areas.

A successful season, such as that we now are experiencing, can easily be completely spoiled by a careless shot in the direction of another hunter or by an unguarded campfire which might bring devastation to the forests. Our lives and our forests are much too valuable to be sacrificed by careless deer hunters.

Each deer season, when the woods are filled with men carrying high-powered rifles, results in a number of deaths which can be charged up to carelessness. And frequently deer seasons are accompanied by devastating forest fires, also due to carelessness.

This year let us hope that it will be different. In payment for the privilege of being allowed to hunt everyone should take special care to eliminate the twin tragedies of the hunting season—slain hunters and burned timber.—Klamath Basin Progress.

airplane factories, the automotive plants, particularly the docks and shipyards and ship personnel?

Cannot the communist program now be ejected from our national life?
