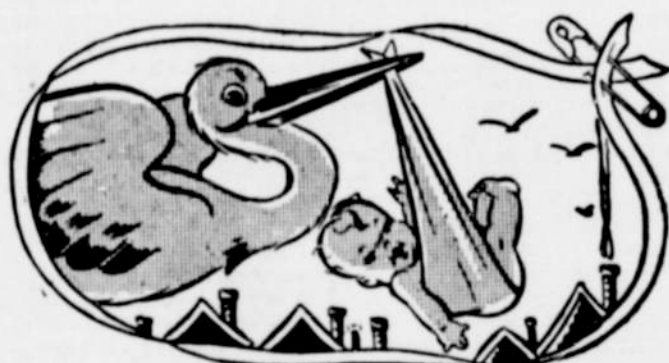
HILTS NEWS
