United States Department of the Interior, General Land Office, O. and C. Administration, Portland, Oregon. Sealed bids, marked outside "Bid for Timber," and addressed to the Chief Forester, O. and C. Administration, 410 Custom House, Portland, Oregon, will be received until 10:30 a. m., Pacific time, May 7, 1940, for the purchase of timber upon tracts hereinafter described; the cutting and removal of the timber to be carried out in accordance with the forest practice rules approved on July 7, 1938 by the Secretary of the Interior. Each bid must state the amount per thousand feet, board measure, that will be paid for each species or class of timber. No bid for less than the appraised value will be considered. Each bid must be submitted in duplicate and be accompanied by a deposit. The deposit must be in the form of a certified check on a solvent National Bank and in favor of the Chief Forester of the O. and C. Administration. The amount of the deposit will be computed at the

rate of at least 20 per cent of the first \$1000 of any estimated stumpage value; at least 10 per cent of the next \$9000 of any estimated stumpage value and at least 5 per cent of any additional estimated stumpage value in excess of \$10,000 and up to \$25,000 in amount. The deposit of any successful bidder will be credited as a first installment in the payment for the timber. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned upon award of the bid. A bond on all sales will be required in an amount computed at the rate of at least 20 per cent of the first \$10,000 of the bid, plus 10 per cent of any additional amount of the bid in excess of \$10,000. Payment for timber will be required in advance of cutting, payment in full at the time of filing the contract being required in sales amounting to \$2500 or less. In larger sales, payment may be made in a number of installments scheduled to keep pace with the rate of timber cutting and payable upon demand from the Chief Forester. The successful bidder in each sale exceeding \$5000 in amount will be required, prior to the approval of the contract covering such sale, to furnish a sworn financial statement showing ability to fulfill the terms of the contract. Johnny Bergstrom, racing the mile in 5:05 for Ashland high in a track meet in Medford Friday, took the only first place for the Grizzlies, who have formed a track team for the first time in four years. The only other first place that didn't go to Medford was the broad jump, which was won by Woodward of Jacksonville with a leap of 20 feet, four inches. Ashland took several second places to total 19 1/2 points to Medford's 95 1/2. Jacksonville, making up the triangle, scored 11 points. Grants Pass, also invited to the meet, did not appear.
