Arising from last week's defeat administered by the Crescent City Merchants, the Ashland-Talent A-T's last Sunday on the local diamond drove out 12 hits to knock three Roseburg pitchers off the mound, and crossed the plate 11 times to down the highly-touted Roseburg Pirates 11 to 2.

Skinny Wilson, right-hand hurler who formerly played with Gold Hill, threw strike after strike to whiff nine Pirate stickmen and allowed six scratch hits, only two of which got out of the infield.

Frank (Nig) DiSordi, playing the third sack for the locals, proved to be the spark needed when he slapped out a long triple to center field and then, as if that weren't enough, stole home under a pitch from Sporer to furnish another tally.

Collins Moore, Bob Strickland, Don Montgomery, Tiny Jones and Skinny Wilson each connected with two-baggers and Ed Leaming outdid himself with a three-base blow which, if it hadn't been for a careful third-base coach, might have been stretched into a home run. Strickland's big deep voice and ball handling were a great addition to a somewhat insecure infield and Jones, who covered the first stopping point, came up with several bad throws to save the day.
