

ASHLAND MEN TO Ashland-Talent To **ADDRESS MEET**

Mayor T. S. Wiley, E. C. Biegel, J. Q. Adams, Councilman O. F. Carson and City Attorney Frank Van Dyke will represent Ashland at the 15th annual League of Oregon Cities convention May 22 to 24 in Seaside.

Ashland also will be represented in discussions when Biegel, manager of the electric utility here and city superintendent, will speak "Operations Under a Contract Electrical Supply," and by Adams, who will talk on "Proper Accounting Treatment of Inter-Fund and Inter-Budget Item Transfers." Other city problems arising from rapid population shifts and increased demands for municipal services coupled with declining revenues will be considered in open forum discussions by city officials in attendance.




