Miner and Varsity Fielders Top First Round Batting List

Harry Pendleton, Miner Press centerfielder, and Elwood Bizeau, third baseman for the Varsity, are leading batters for the first one-third of the city softball league. Pendleton has batted officially five times and collected three hits for an average of .600 while Bizeau has been up 14 times for eight hits and an average of .571.
