The first evening of the three-day entertainment program will be climaxed with a giant display of fireworks at 10:30 o'clock, to be set off from Scenic drive between Church and Nutley streets by the fire department. The pyrotechnics will be visible from all parts of the city.

The second day will start off with a city-wide merchants' sales event in which all merchants, in order to gain by the large crowds here through the week, will hold individual special sales.

At 2 p. m. Friday an informal tea will be held in the Lithia hotel for Queen Bess and her court.

At the second showing of the Cavalcade of the Siskiyou starting at 8:30 o'clock Friday night, Queen Elizabeth, her court and special guests will be honored.

Immediately following the Cavalcade showing and starting at 10:30 p. m. a queens' ball will be held at the Chateau three miles north of Ashland, and while it is not invitational, reservations should be made.

A soap box derby and children's races and games, starting at 10 a. m. in Lithia park, will open the third and final day and will be followed by a swimming party and water carnival for the queen, to be held in Jackson Hot Springs.
