Whether or not weekly wrestling matches, which resume next Monday after a four-month layoff, will continue to be held at Medford armory each week depends entirely on the support of the fans.

Promoter Mack Lillard will begin the weekly festivities April 21 on a trial basis only, which will continue five or six weeks. If the fans show enough enthusiasm during this trial period to warrant continuation of these matches Lillard will do just that; otherwise, valley fans will have to go to Klamath Falls where Lillard promotes wrestling every Tuesday evening.

Mat bugs can't blame Lillard for his decision, either, since the impresario dropped a tidy sum during 1940 through Medford grapple cards. 1939 was no money-making year as far as Lillard was concerned while 1938 showed a slim profit.

Taking the wrestling cards away from Medford will be taking money out of the pockets of Ashland business men. Lillard spends close to \$400 a year in Ashland alone for advertising and almost everytime the grapplers go thru to Klamath Falls they stop in some Ashland eating house for a meal and those with families have, in the past, stayed in Ashland tourist camps and bought Ashland groceries. This, of course, is in addition to money dropped in Medford.

If any guy deserves support of the public in an undertaking, that guy is Lillard. He is one of the grandest fellows Hindsight has ever known, having been acquainted with him almost all of the writer's life, and he is a right smart promoter.

Several fans, in the past, have complained to I Told You So about Lillard bringing so many faces back to Medford. What they do not know is that those men Lillard brings to Medford are the best possible to secure in the junior heavyweight division and often the men Lillard puts in the preliminary spots are top notch wrestlers who hold down main event positions in the arenas of big cities all over the United States.

Many Reservations For Music Festival

Twenty-six schools have already signified their intention of entering the SOCE Music Festival, under the direction of Miss Louise Woodruff, of the College music department. This festival will be held at the college Thursday and Friday, April 24 and 25.

The musical activities will include a junior band, demonstrations of physical education dancing, rhythm band, a choral group, demonstrations of violin classes and choir groups from grades three to nine, an unchanged voice chorus, a boys' mixed chorus, and a junior high school orchestra.

From the advanced reservations, a total of 1395 students already plan to enter the festival.
