The almost complete annihilation of this disease is a tribute to the preventive work being done by the public health workers of Oregon.

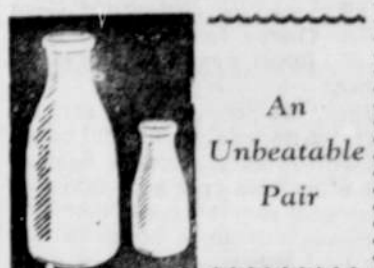

Final flight examinations are being given at the Medford airport.
