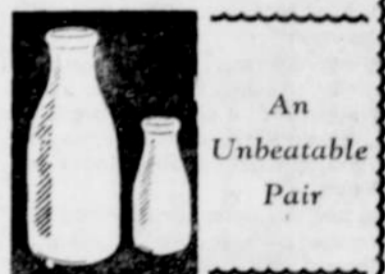
● George Pfeiffer and Jim Stone spent Sunday at Diamond lake. They were successful in catching a nice lot of the finny tribe.
