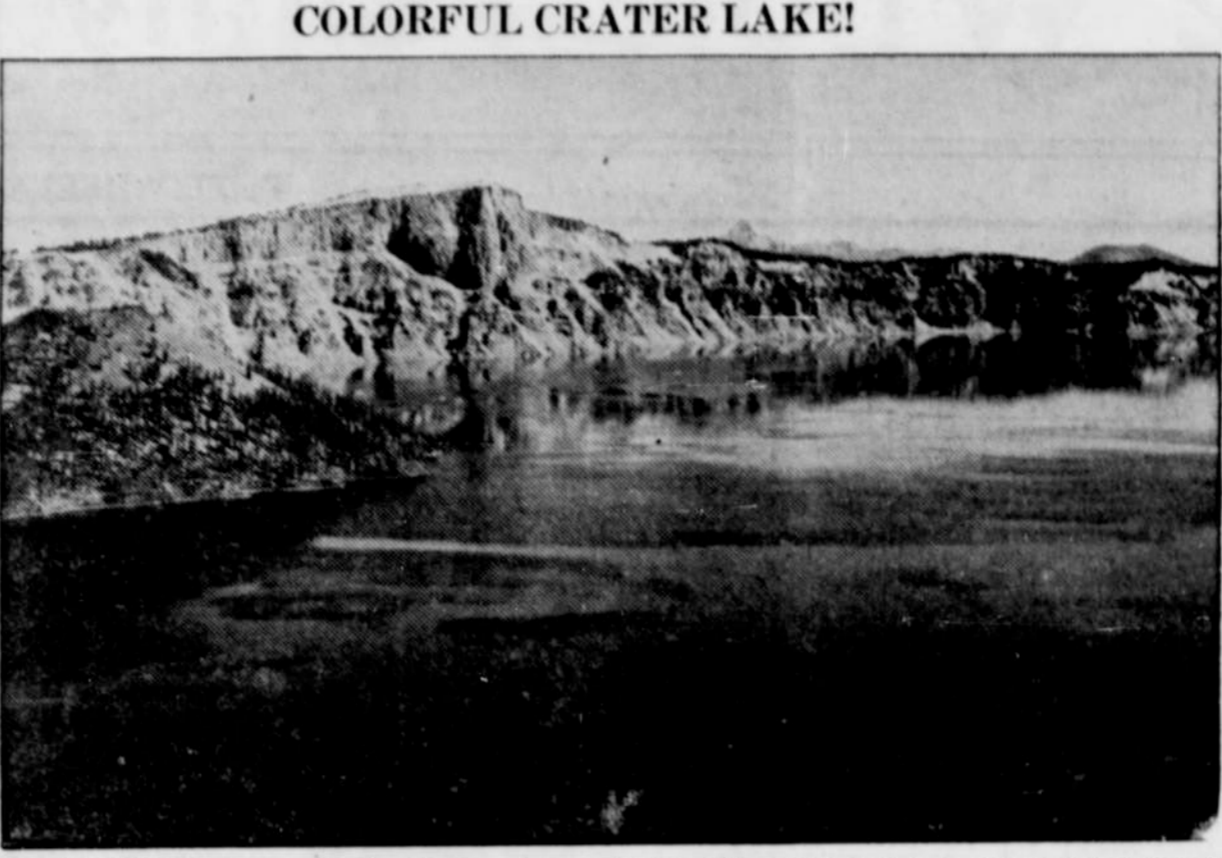

HINDSIGHT ON SPORTS
By I TOLD YOU SO

Death took a deep cut at collegiate football Sunday with the passing of Howard Harding Jones from a heart attack. The 55-year old coach had been at the University of Southern California since 1925 and had been drawing down \$15,000 a year since 1934.
Jones played football at Phillips-Exeter Academy and at Yale but was not an outstanding player. He was far better at showing someone else how to play than he was at doing it himself. He coached at Syracuse, Yale, Ohio State, Iowa and Duke before coming to USC.
Jones had an all-time record of 194 victories, 65 defeats and 21 ties in 29 seasons for an average of .754. At USC his teams had won 121, lost 36 and tied 18. Twenty of his players have been chosen All-American; 11 of them from Southern California. He has had five USC teams in the Rose Bowl and all have won. He has had two Big Ten champions and three Pacific Coast championship teams. His teams also tied for the Pacific Coast title five times.
At USC Jones developed a system bearing his name which consists of a full-team shift into an unbalanced strength to either the left or right. Most of the weight was placed upon the quarterback and, as Jones used to say, the rest of the backs were in there only to block.
He ranked with Knute Rockne and Glenn S. (Pop) Warner as the greatest football mentor in the country.
Sam Berry, head baseball and basketball coach at USC, might get the assignment to fill Jones' shoes for the next season since most of the coaches already are signed for the coming year. Berry has been Jones' assistant for some time.
Sgt. Bob Kennastoo, the rascal villain from Gold Hill, has regained the world junior-heavyweight championship from Frankie Talaber during his present campaign in the east.
