Farm Crops Used in Producing Autos

The automobile industry is one of the farmer's best customers according to a report based on the extensive use of farm products by Ford Motor company in building cars and trucks.

It is estimated that for each 1,000,000 units it manufactures, Ford needs the following agricultural items:

69,300,000 pounds of cotton, 3,-204,000 pounds of wool, 112,000, 000 board feet of wood, 30,000 head of cattle to provide 1,500.000 square feet of leather, 600,000 bushels of soy beans, 118,000 bushels of flax, 451,000 bushels of corn, 120,000 pounds of flour, 2,-500,000 gallons of sugar cane molasses, pine pitch 2,060,000 pounds, 83,000,000 bees to produce 6,000 pounds of beeswax and 150,000

gallons of castor oil. Soybeans have many uses in the Ford industries, due to the pioneering efforts of Henry Ford in trying to find more and better uses for farm products in his plants. Chief among them are in the body finishes, moulded elec-trical parts and as core oil and bond in the foundry. Flax is utilized in paints, core oil, soft soaps and glycerine.
