Produce Shipments Show Increase

Carlots shipments of fruit and vegetables from Oregon showed an increase of 136 cars in October over September, according to the plant division of the state department of agriculture. October shipments totaled 2,278 cars and 1,183 trucklots. In September the carlot movement was 2,142 and trucklots 431.

Potatoes accounted for the largest movement, with 999 cars and 701 trucks inspected and certified last month. Pears were second, with 500.5 cars and 25 trucks, and third was onions with 312 cars. Apples, with 186.5 cars and 20 truckloads, ranked fourth. Shipments of other commodities were under 150 cars.
