SURPRISED ON BIRTHDAY

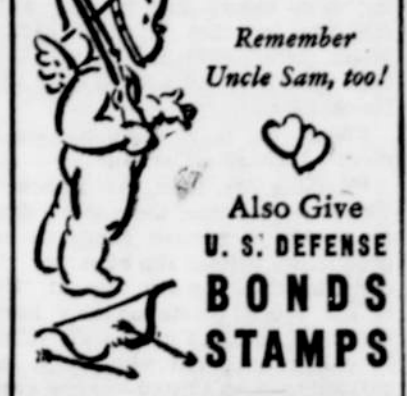
