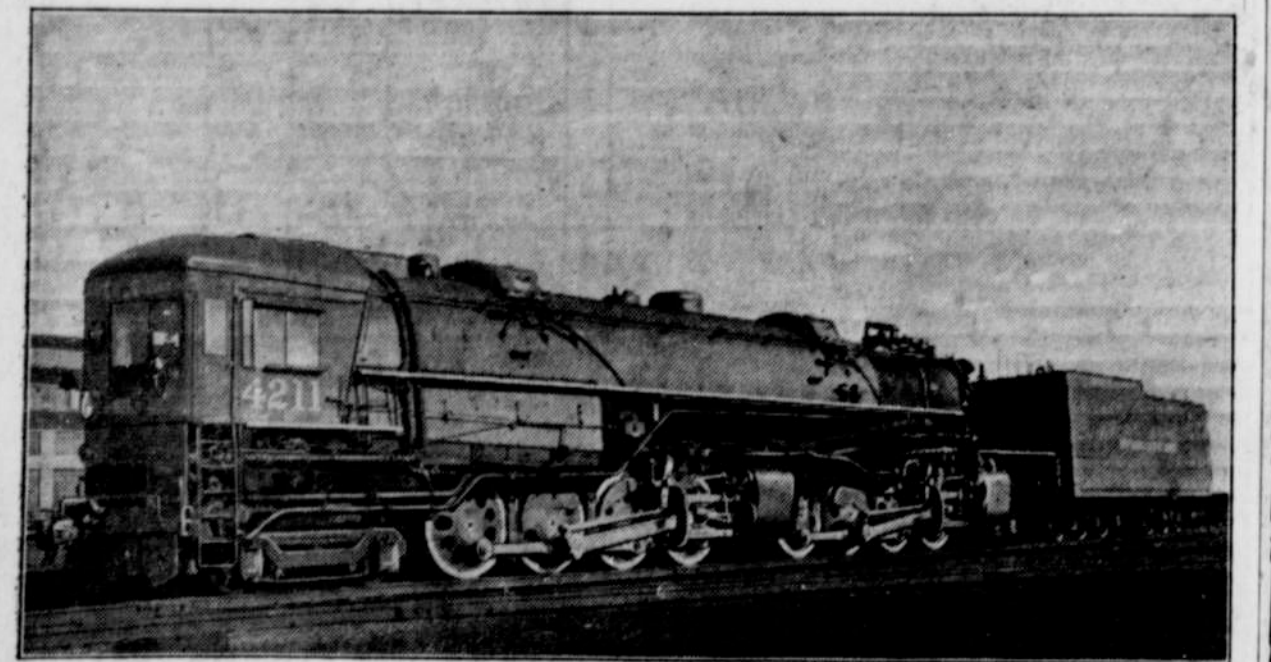

MODERN MASTER OF MOUNTAIN GRADES



IN keeping with the war-time acceleration of its rail traffic, Southern Pacific Lines has ordered 70 of these giant heavy-duty, oil-burning freight and passenger steam locomotives from The Baldwin Locomotive Works, Philadelphia.
 Engine cabs are in front for greater visibility over the heavy grades and through the tunnels of the Sierra Nevada and other mountainous parts of Southern Pacific Lines where 175 of this general type of Baldwin-built locomotives will be in service with the completion of this latest order. Ten of the new engines already have been delivered this year.
 This is a Class 4-8-2 locomotive, with four cylinders and a tractive force of 124,300 pounds. Engine and tender weigh 1,051,200 pounds. The tender holds 6,100 gallons of oil and 22,000 gallons of water. Wheel base of engine and tender is 112 feet, two inches.
