CAMP WHITE SOLDIER GIVEN STIFF RAP

It was announced Thursday by Headquarters Camp White, that the trial of Pvt. William L. Bryson had been concluded. Bryson was tried on January 29 at Camp White for stabbing of a staff sergeant last November 15, in the Greyhound Bus Tavern at Ashland, Ore. The general court martial sentence given Bryson was that he was to be dishonorably discharged from the service, to forfeit all pay and allowance due and to become due, and to be confined for 10 years. The record of the case now goes to authorities for general review and approval.

The Bryson case is the first general court martial to be handled by the service command unit, Camp White, Ore.
