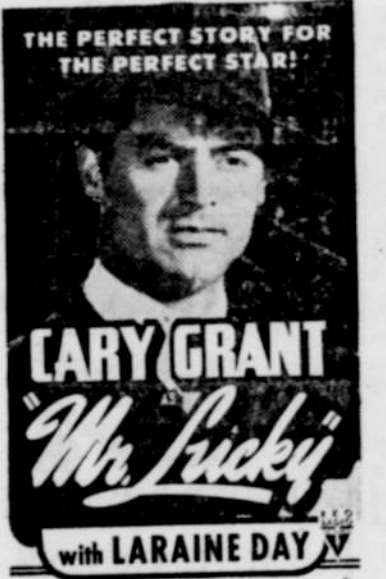

DECREASE OF ONE PERCENT IN VEHICLE REGISTRATION
Motor vehicle registrations in Oregon at the end of July totaled 401,795, Bob Farrell, secretary of state, announced today. This compares to a registration of 408,437 vehicles a year ago, a decrease of a little over one per cent.
There were 323,673 private passenger cars registered in the state, 1,080 busses, 32,989 light trucks and 41,038 heavy trucks.
Registration fees total \$3,247,888 compared to \$3,209,044. The increase is due to increased numbers of trucks and busses registered in the state. Truck registrations are up three percent and bus registrations show an increase of 42 percent.

Large Enrollment In Daily Vacation Bible Schools

More than 3,000,000 children vacation Bible Schools in 90,000 centers across the country which are sponsored by Protestant churches and inter-church agencies, according to an estimate made by the International Council of Religious Education, a cooperative agency which represents 10 percent of American Protestantism.

Children of all races and creeds from defense housing projects, trailer camps, slum areas of big cities, rural and mountain areas, and the homes of average Americans in thousands of small and large towns in every state attend these schools, regardless of whether they or their parent are or are not members of the sponsoring church or churches. Financial support is provided for the most part by the churches, but in some localities a small fee, such as one cent a day is charged, or funds are given through offerings.

Lessons in Christian democracy are taught to these children, in addition to Bible lessons, and arts and crafts. Supervised recreational programs for all afternoon are included in some of the schools.

"Daily vacation schools are helping to meet the problem of what to do with the kiddies for thousands of war working mothers," states Miss Ruth Elizabeth Murphy, associate director of this work for the International Council. "We expect a definite decline in the rising amount of juvenile delinquency in many communities because of these schools in the churches."

Protestantism is meeting the growing demand for summer church school programs for children despite the increased lack of trained workers and the fewer high school young people who can be called upon for assistance. Recent figures released by Rev. Otto Mayer, director of research for the International Council, show that in 1942 there were 53,039 vacation church schools with 223,163 teachers and 2,090,042 pupils, representing increases of 71, 9, and 6 per cent, respectively, over the same figures for 1939.

In many government housing projects, administrators cooperate with the churches by providing a maintenance building for the daily vacation church schools. Lacking other facilities, tents are being used in such cities as Baltimore and Detroit for classes in trailer camps, located in defense areas.

The Council of Social Agencies, the USO, the Defense Council, the YMCA, and YWCA are cooperating with the Los Angeles Church Federation in promoting and sponsoring 410 vacation church schools, many of which are running all summer. Southern California claims nearly 800 schools with a total enrollment of more than 100,000 children.

Thirty thousand children from "the sidewalks of New York" receive daily training in Bible study, directed games, supervised trips, music, writing and arts and crafts in the 290 schools operated by the Metropolitan Federation of Daily Vacation Bible Schools, an interdenominational agency.

Vacation Church schools sponsored by the Ramsey County Sunday School Association, St. Paul, Minnesota, which take care of more than 1,500 children, co-ordinate their programs with the summer recreation activities provided by the Community Chest "to keep children and young people busy this summer."
