Presbyterians Hold Monthly Meeting

The Women's Association of the Presbyterian Church met in an all-day session September 2nd. Mrs. J. C. Whittier opened the Spiritual Life Group in prayer and then discussed tithing and its many benefits. Mrs. J. W. McCoy presided during the business meeting and reports were made as to the preparation for the Rummage sale to be held September 18th at the Gas office. Material for the sale is to be brought to the church by Sept. 11. Miss Juanita Demmer told of her summer spent at the University of Oregon and described life at Westminster House. Mrs. Virgil Jackson, a former officer of the Association, now living in Portland, greeted the group and was delighted to be visiting in Ashland.

The third self-denial luncheon was served at flower centered tables by the hostesses, Mrs. Geo. Nichols, Mrs. Agnes Boulton and Miss Estella Hays.

In opening the afternoon session program chairman, Mrs. W. D. Jackson introduced the guest speaker, Mrs. Chas. M. Giffen, who brought an excellent report of missionary work done in Utah.

Missionary work in Utah resembles foreign work in several respects. Much of it is not self-supporting. The territory is allocated among the Protestant denominations. In mining centers there are many languages used. As in a foreign field there is a dominant religion with ideas differing from our own.

Westminster College and Watsch Academy, both Presbyterian institutions, rate highly. Most of the instructors have Master's degrees. Inter-mountain Conferences are held with five denominations participating, to discuss the solution of the problems peculiar to this section. Mrs. Giffen was a former pastor of a Methodist Church located at Marysville, Utah, and the congregation represented many denominations.

Mrs. Giffen also told of her work at Bingham Canyon. Because of the large amount of mining in this area, the population is of many nationalities, speaking as many as twenty languages.

Copperfield in Bingham Canyon has the largest open-pit copper mine in the world. A narrow road seven miles long goes through Bingham Canyon. Houses are built along the creek and are very close together without proper sanitation or fire protection. Land and snow slides constitute additional hazards for the people in this area.

The Community House at Bingham Canyon has among other projects, a health clinic to serve the people. In one day this clinic removed the tonsils from 30 children.

Devotions for the afternoon were led by Mrs. Clyde Smith. Mrs. Giffen closed the meeting with prayer.

Oregon War Chest Allotments Made

The total amount to be raised in Oregon during the October campaign for the Oregon War Chest will be \$1,365,200, according to announcement made today by Charles A. Sprague, president. Of this amount \$235,844 will be allocated to support seven major state-wide child-caring agencies in Oregon.

There are 17 member agencies of the National War Fund participating in this campaign. The state agencies are: Boys' and Girls' Aid Society, Catholic Charities, Inc., Children's Farm Home, Oregon Protective Society, Salvation Army, Volunteers of America and the Waverly Baby Home.

This budget was accepted by the Board of Directors of the Oregon War Chest at a meeting some time ago. It was recognized that various communities will add funds to the state allotment so that purely local agencies may receive help.

The allotment for Jackson County is \$34,100.
