Oregon War Chest Allotments Mage

in Oregon during the October campaign for the Oregon War Chest will be \$1,365,200, according to announcement made today by Charles A. Sprague, president. and Mrs. Jordan are brother and Of this amount \$235,844 will be allocated to support seven major state-wild child-caring agencles in Oregon.

There are 17 member agencies of the National War Fund participating in this campaign. The state agencies- are: Boys' and Girls' Aid Society, Catholic Charities, Inc., Children's Farm Home, Oregon Protective Society, Salvation Army, Volunteers of America and the Waverly Baby Home.

This budget was accepted by the Board of Directors- of the Oregon War Chest at a meeting some time ago. It was recognized that various communities will add funds to the state allotment so that purely local agencies may receive help.

The allotment for Jackson County is \$34,100.
