my American? It is selection. The boys come from all ranks of life, from farm and factory, from village and city, from the work bench and the class room. There is no question of class, no bar of national origin of the names they bear, no dispute as to their religion. They are chosen because they are physically fit and mentally able to do a hard job - because they are tough enough to take it - and to hand it

It is leadership. With only a small standing army war found us with too few men trained to lead But that never stopped an American army. The boys in the ranks were culled by their officers and if they showed any qualities of leadership, they were pushed into officers training acmps there to earn their ratings. Gossip mongers to the contrary, practically none of our officers were selected because of their "friends". Most have come up from the ranks through sheer ability and hard work. SEWING MACH. CARE GIVEN IN BULLETIN

Shortage of repair men just at a time when homemakers need to have their sewing machines in good running order constantly has ed to the publication of a fourpage circular on the care and adjustment of sewing machines, just ssued by the O.S.C Extension ser-

Tais circular, written by Lucy Lane, extension specialist in cicthing and textiles, is intended to supplement the information contained in sewing machine instruction books supplied by the manufacturer. It contains a picture of a typical sewing machine head with all parts clearly marked to be used as a glide in following the directions for cleaning, olling, and adjusting sewing mach'nes.

This pamphlet issued as extension bulletin No. 624, is particuanly valuable in case the original instruction book has been lost. Copies may be obtained free from any county extension agent or direct from the college,

Pedestrian Accidents On Increase

Jaywalking, the practice of crossing streets between intersecsections, is on the increase in Oregon, a survey made by the safety division of the secretary of state office's disclosed.

This unsafe practice was reported in 166 percent more pedestrian fatalities during the first six months of 1943 than for the same period of 1942. Eight persons were killed while crossing streets between intersections during that period this year, compared to only three for the comparative period a year ago.

Pedestrian fatalities have increased a little over 40 percent so far this year, while other types of traffic fatalities are showing a downward trend, the safety division's survey showed.

Indicative of the fact that increased numbers of pedestrians aalone is not responsible for the increase in deaths, the division reported that unsafe walking practices were factors in 80 percent more pedestrian accidents this also separate colors very carefully. year than a year ago.
