Taking all of Jackson County's 36,213 people around the world in sleeping cars nearly 18 times would be a tremendous undertaking, yet that is actually about the size of the troop movement job reported today by the Pullman Co.

Since Pear Harbor, Pullman has carried about 14,000,000 troops a distance of more than 15 billion passenger miles in its sleeping cars, the company reports. These figures are said to cover mass military movements alone, and do not include the heavy travel of furloughed men and others.
