We are thankful that we have learned the privilege of living in the greatest hour of history, that we can in that hour be of service to our brothers everywhere, whatever their class, creed or color.

As Chesterton so aptly said, "The way to love anything is to realize that it might be lost." We have learned what we really love — and for that knowledge while there is yet time to keep it, we are thankful!

## VICAR SPEAKS AT SOCE ASSEMBLY

The Reverend A. H. McDonnell, vicar of the Trinity Episcopal Church of Ashland, addressed the students of the Southern Oregon College of Education at assembly Wednesday morning, November 24, his topic, "For what I am thankful."

Outlining the topic, the Rev. McDonnell listed three main items for which to be thankful. First, the unanimity of opinion and spirit in this country which contributes to the speed of bringing the present war to a victorious end; second, the privilege of living in a country in which victory not defeatism is the controlling philosophy; third, the possession of those Christian principles which he believes, he stated, is the source of the spirit animating this country.
