

WINDSHIELD STICKERS NOW VALID IN OREGON

Windshield stickers validating the 1944 registration of motor vehicles in Oregon now may be used. They became valid yesterday (Dec. 15).

When the new 1944 stickers are attached to windshields, the old 1943 stickers must be removed, Farrell said. No stickers, except authorized ones, may be displayed on windshields in this state and the 1943 sticker will not be authorized after the new one is in place. this state under reciprocal agreements with adjoining states, must now take out an Oregon registration. He will receive, in addition to the sticker, a set of 1942 license plates. Titles of these cars also must be transferred from the state of registration in 1943 to Oregon.

Plans Made for Speech Tournament

A speech tournament sponsored by the Oregon High School Speech League will be held on the University of Oregon campus, Eugene, March 30, 31 and April 1. It was learned this week from Robert D. Clark, secretary of the league, and assistant professor of speech and dramatic arts at the university. The league is directed by the speech staffs of Oregon State College and the University of Oregon through the general extension division of the state system of higher education.

The league, which is a subdivision of the Oregon High School Activities Association, is divided into 11 districts, each of which will hold elimination contests in debate and preliminary non-elimination contests in such other events as desired. These preliminary events, which must be held by March 18, may be in panel discussion, oratory, extempore speaking, after dinner speaking, radio speaking, poetry, humorous reading and any other topics.

At the spring tournament each school may enter two contestants in a contest, although no student may enter more than two contests. However, in the preliminaries there is no limit to the number of entries. As in past years cups will be awarded the winners, and this year certificates or other suitable awards will be given.

The topic for debate this year is "Resolved: That the United States Should Join in Reconstituting the League of Nations." The handbook, "Oregon High School Speech League Handbook, 1943-44," just published by the extension division, gives further details concerning the contests.
