Winning with War Transportation

At a meeting in the office of Director Eastman, Office of Defense Transportation, held during the latter part of November, and which was attended by representatives of the Association of American Railroads, American Short Line Association, Interstate Commerce Commission, National Industrial Traffic League, National Association of Shippers' Advisory Boards and the Associated Traffic Clubs of America, it was decided to set the sights at an increase of 10 per cent in equipment utilization.

To accomplish this will require intensified effort of the government, the carriers, and the shippers. In recognition of the need for co-ordinated effort, a War Transportation Efficiency Committee was organized, with Director Eastman as chairman; W. H. Day of the New England Shippers' Advisory Board, vice chairman, and Edward F. Lacey, executive secretary of the National Industrial Traffic League, secretary. Other members of this committee consist of representatives of organizations mentioned in the first paragraph above. This committee will not take over the work of existing efficiency groups, as these groups have been instrumental in lifting the efficiency of transportation to its present wartime level; however, they will be called upon to intensify their efforts during the period which lies directly ahead.
