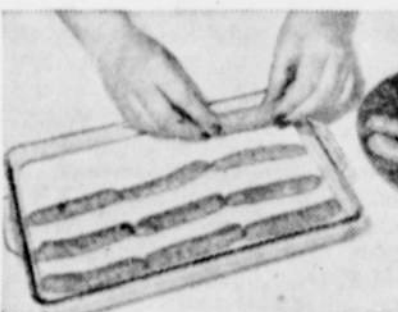


SAUSAGE LINKS IN
BATTER PUDDING



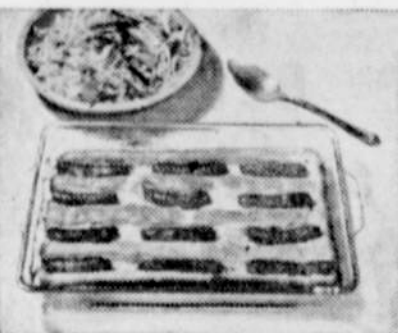
The Ingredients

Heat two cups milk in a double boiler. Add 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 cup corn meal. Cook 10-15 minutes stirring constantly to avoid lumps



Making the Batter

Cool slightly and add 4 well beaten eggs. Pour this mixture into a well greased baking dish. Place sausage links on top of mixture.
