Greyhound Runs Ad for Air WACs

Mobilizing the power of its newspaper advertising behind the Armed Forces, Pacific Greyhound Lines has run four advertisements in the past few months to stimulate recruiting. The first was for the Seabees, when that branch of the Navy was in urgent need of construction mechanics in the Pacific. This was followed in succession by large advertisements for the Waves, Women's Reserve of the Marine Corps and the Wac. The latter advertisement appears in this issue of the Southern Oregon Miner. Each advertisement was run in more than 500 western newspapers.
