This was announced by Herb. Crain of the Medford Navy recruiting station, who said it is likely that many men with such a background may qualify for radar training, leading to quuck advancement in Naval service as well as to opportunities in the post-war field of electronics.

The Eddy test, it was emphasized, is nothing for he man of average intelligence and education to shy away from, consisting merely of problems of basic math ematics, fundamental electricity, elecmentary physics, pratical shopwork and simple radio, with stress placed upon math.

Many of the radio and electricity questions therein may be anewered simply by reasoning or thinking them out and do not nec essarily require any previous ex-perience in those fields for solution, Candidates were advised some improvement. that when taking the test, it is preferable to make an intelligent guess rather than to leave any question unanswered.

Complete information concerning the Eddy test and other details of the Navy radar training program, which offers petty officer ratings to candidates complet ing this training, will be supplied at any Navy recruiting station.
