Applied for Licenses Small Number Have

Approximately 17 percent of the motor vehicle owners in Oregon have applied for their 1945 registrations, according to Robert S. Farrell, secretary of state, who today urged the remaining 83 percent to apply at once in order to avoid last-minute delays.

With more than 400,000 vehicles registered in Oregon, slightly more than 70,000 applications now are on file in the secretary of state's office. While this is 21 percent ahead of last year, there should be many more in the near future, if delays are to be avoided, Farrell said.

Mail congestion during the holiday season, and lack of manpower to process great numbers of applications in a short period make it important that applications come in early.

Windshield stickers now are being mailed from the state department and they may be attached to the windshield after December 15.
