The Stars and Stripes, and the cross-marked graves of our heroes, represent a passion which could not be satisfied with anything short of the best these noble men had to offer.

Lewis and Donald loved America, not for America alone, but for what America has to offer to its citizens and to every man woman and child in the whole wide world. America is their home-land, and ours. We all are its people. Come what may, for the sake of our souls, our homes, and our freedom we must passionately stand together. They craved the blessings and privileges and opportunities of America for all mankind.

Life was dear and precious to these young men. One of them wrote in a recent letter to his parents, "I am trusting God for everything. I want to live, but if I can accomplish God's purpose for my life by dying, then I am ready to die. I want God to have His way always with me." What a faith! What a hope! The living or the death of a man like that is never defeat. A man like that

is unconquerable. We love our heroic dead, and we honor their memories. It is our sacred obligation to pay tribute to them, and to mark their graves with crosses and bedeck them with flowers. But it is more important that we dedicate our lives and fortunes upon the altars of their memorial, and that we give our all that the dreams of our heroes for a new world may be realized.

**DONALD! LEWIS!** Your warfare is over! It did end early, and perhaps you had little fighting chance in this world, but you most certainly have done your full share toward making this "much better" world about which you have dreamed. Now for you, the flak-filled skies have cleared, and the blazing gun have disappeared, and your arms and uniforms have been laid away. There will be no more loneliness, nor suffering, nor sorrow, nor pain—just peace and quiet—like the peace and quiet of a deep slumber. The Great Leader has said, "At Ease!"

**LEWIS! DONALD!** Your lives were short, but they were rich and deep and highly significant. We shall never forget your courage and sacrifice. Your faith and hope and manliness have won you a place in the hearts of all who knew you best. We will not say "Goodbye" as we said when you were inducted into the army.
