Southern Oregon College of Education, May 9.—Victory Day was observed at the Southern Oregon College of Education Wednesday morning, May 9, with an hour of ceremonies which included music, readings, and a fifteen minute address by R. W. McNeal. The speaker drew a contrast between the battle scarred lands of Europe and the more fortunate state of America. Americans, he stated, cannot forget the debt of gratitude due members of the armed forces whose sacrifices have saved America from devastation, and brought a day of victory.

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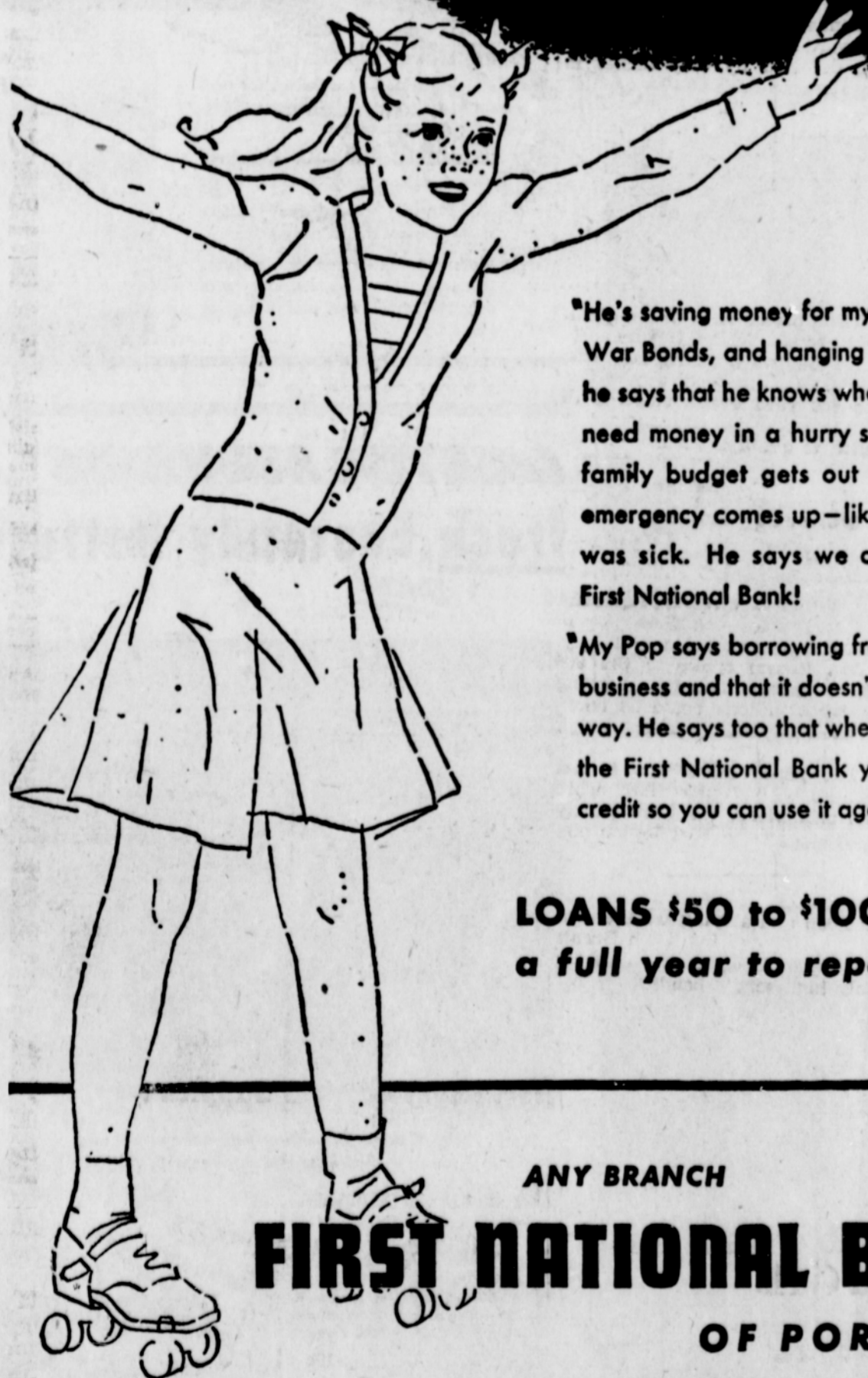
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
