

Many Cases in Police Court this Week

Charles J. Hubbard, aged 20, of Spokane, Washington, was arrested at midnight Friday on a charge of defrauding an innkeeper by giving a N.S.F. check for a month's rent. On investigation it was found he had several of these checks out, and had also violated the O.P.A. ration regulations by using gasoline obtained from friends and other sources. He was charged in City Court with defrauding an Innkeeper, to which he plead guilty this morning and was fined \$75.00 and \$2.50 costs and 25 days in jail. \$50.00 of the fine and the jail sentence were suspended on condition the N.S.F. checks are made good and on good behavior. The Defendant was held in jail for three days pending his hearing.

Pvt. James Charles Gould, of Ashland, Oregon, was arrested Sunday night on a charge of driving a motor vehicle while intoxicated. He crashed his car into a city lamp post on Winburn Way, wrecking the car and doing \$15.00 damage to the lamp post. The Defendant was held in City Jail until sober and then turned over to the Military Police from Camp White. The car was held in storage until damages to the City property are paid.

Pvt. Winston W. Frohlich, of Phoenix, Oregon, was in the car that crashed, and was arrested on a charge of driving drunk. He was held for the Military Police. Both Gould and Frohlich were on furlough.

Enos Emil Post of Ashland, was arrested Sunday afternoon on a disorderly conduct charge and resisting arrest. He was held in Jail for trial Monday morning, plead guilty, and was fined \$25.00 and \$2.50 costs and was given 25 days in jail. sentence was suspended on payment of fine and on a promise of good behavior.

John W. Smith, of Medford, Oregon, was arrested Sunday evening by our "Park Patrol" on the charge of driving his car up on a pedestrian path in the main part of Lithia Park. The Defendant plead guilty to the charge and was fined \$3.00 and \$2.50 costs. Dr. Bruce Talks to Talent Graduates
