

County Court Appoints Howard Gault as Sheriff

Howard C. Gault, chief deputy in the sheriff's office, was appointed Wednesday to serve out the unexpired term of Sheriff Syd I. Brown who passed away

more than a week ago.

Gault was sworn in early Wednesday afternoon and announced he would retain the present office personnel. Members of the county court said early naming of the sheriff's successor was necessary in order to handle legal matters pertaining to the office.

The new sheriff was appointed as chief deputy in 1935, and has served since then except for several months at Camp White. His

appointment is for the term ending with the year 1946. Candidates for the office will enter the primary in 1946 and the party selection will then compete in the general election in the fall of that year. The successful candidate will assume office with the start of 1947.

The newly appointed sheriff is a native of Medford having been born there in 1905, the son of pioneer parents. He and Mrs. Gault and their three children make their home at 105 Tripp Street.—Mail Tribune.

Myrtle Creek Man Is Given Advance Rank

With the 25th Infantry (Tropic Lightning) Division on Luzon:—From the battlegrounds of northern Luzon where the veteran 25th Division is now in its fifth consecutive month of action against the Japanese, comes word of the promotion of Louis A. Donelan, son of Clem Donelan Myrtle Creek to private first class.

A veteran of the 25th Division's battles on the Central Luzon Plains and the recent fierce, bloody action in the Caraballo mountains as the "Tropic Lightning" troops inched their way to the important Balet Pass and on to Santa Fe. Pfc. Donelan is a mechanic on an M-7 Gun Carriage, the mobile artillery of the infantry that has been blasting the Nips on Luzon.

The 25th Division, commanded by Major General Charles L. Mullins, Jr., has experienced more than three and on half years overseas service in this war. They were present at the Pearl Harbor attack and later went into action against the Japanese on Guadalcanal, New Georgia, and Vella LaVella in the Solomon Islands. It was because of their distinguished services in Solomon jungle fighting that they were dubbed the "Tropic Lightning" Division.

Before entering the army Pfc. Donelan was employed by the Conley Logging Company, Ashland, Oregon.
