As Assistant Executive, Chief of Correspondence Control Section, which involves preventing unnecessary delay in answering correspondence and radio messages and checking all radios for proper distribution. Clear as mud?

This headquarters is in a partially destroyed building across from one of the piers, so there is plenty of activity, with unloading of ships at our "front door", reconstruction of this building as we try to work, construction of barracks across the street and trucks rumbling by continually.

Even when it's raining, we are "wallowing" in the dust.

I now have more pleasant quarters, in a concrete building which was formerly a nurses quarters of a Philippine Hospital—one side of each room is open, onto a wide balcony which extends the length of the building. Most of us have our cots on the balcony. In spite of the wide eaves of the building, the rain blows in to some extent, but that is a minor difficulty. We WAC Officers go back and forth to work in jeeps and the EW's go by truck.

Parts of the hospital buildings, not too badly damaged are still being used as a hospital. Some of our officers have visited patients here who are in a pathetic condition from being crushed or burned, or from other injuries received during the bombings, and some terribly emaciated, who still have not recovered since liberation. The report is that these people suffer silently, without a word of complaint.

**July Was Hotter Than Average, Report**

Monthly report issued by the U. S. weather bureau at Medford showed that July of this year was somewhat warmer than normal with a deficiency of rainfall of .30 inches. Mean maximum temperature for the month was 92.5 degrees as compared with the average monthly mean maximum of 90.7 degrees. The monthly mean minimum was 55.8 degrees. This gives an average monthly average temperature of 74.2 degrees or 1.5 degrees above normal. The average lowest temperature for past years is 54.7 degrees.

No measureable precipitation fell at the bureau during the month, but rain from thunder storms fell in spotted areas of the valley on July 10 and 28. A trace of rain fell on the 18.

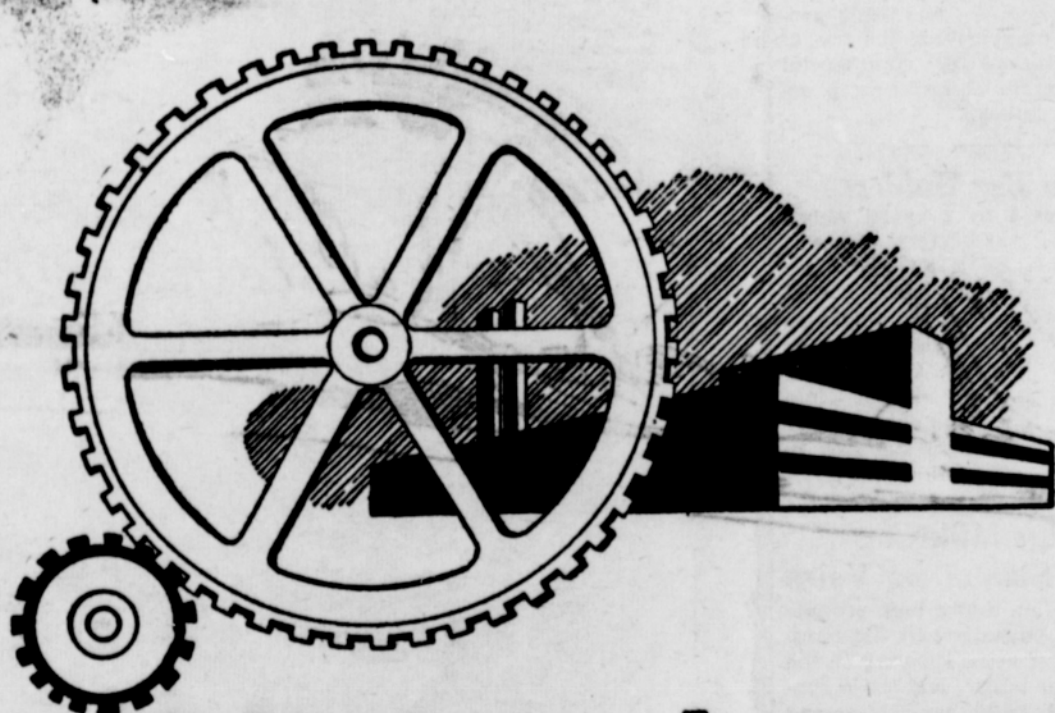
There were 25 clear days, four partly cloudy days and two cloudy days according to the report.

With exception of the very warm days during the first of the month, the weather was fine, good for crops in the valley, according to C. B. Cordy, assistant county agricultural agent.
