

Coast Guard Wants More 17-Year Olds

Recruiting of young men 17 years of age has been reopened by the United States Coast Guard at Alameda, California. Many will be sent on to advanced schools for special training. Applicants must be 17, at least 64 inches in height with weight in proportion to height, in good health and have at least two years' high school, parent's consent and a birth certificate. Recruits will be enlisted in

regular Coast Guard, for three-year periods. Wartime recruiting was for the Coast Guard Reserve, members signing up to serve "the duration and six months" or less.

Boys Vandalism Brings Arrests

Ashland police arrested four youths Tuesday, in a car found to be stolen at Salem. Arrested were Charles Keith Gepner, 17, Clyde Edward Seidel, 19, Mrs. Ann Lee Dugan, 21 and Mrs. Dorothy Mae Tipton, 18, all of Salem. They were in possession of a 1936 Dodge coupe, which had been previously reported stolen at Salem. The arrests were made by Officers Redfer and Chickering at about 1:30 Tuesday morning.

It was found that felony charges were already being held against the two boys by Salem authorities. The four were taken to the Jackson county jail at Medford to await arrival of the officers from Salem. The two girls are being held for investigation.

was intoxicated at the time of the arrest. Key plead guilty to the charge and was fined \$150 and \$2.50 costs and given ten days in jail. Judge Presnall suspended \$125 of the fine and the jail sentence on the promise of good behavior, if the balance of the fine and costs were paid.

Police Arrest Four In Stolen Auto

Richard Allen White, 16 and Leroy William Dixon, 17 both of Medford are in custody of the Jackson county juvenile officer, after being arrested by Assistant Chief of Police Clarence Williams Monday, charged with burglary of several items at the Ashland Mine and at the Fred Van Culer ranch. They later admitted breaking into several buildings at the mine, removing numerous small articles and cutting a seven foot piece of 12-inch belting out of a roll in one of the buildings. All articles were recovered by the police. White was also taken into city court on a charge of driving a car without a driver's license, for which he was given a fine of \$5.00 and costs.

Two Local Men on the Alabama in Pacific

Aboard The USS Alabama in the Pacific—Cliford McLean, radarman, third class, USNR, whose wife, Margaret, lives at 117 Almond St., Ashland, Oregon and Dick L. Merriman, musician,

third class, USNR, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. A. Merriman, 384 Helman St., Ashland, Oregon are serving aboard this battleship which in one month's time raided the Japanese mainland twice, bombarded a Jap-held island north of Okinawa and rode unscathed through a violent typhoon.

One of the raids against the Nip homeland was uneventful, but during the other operation the "Mighty A," as the man-of-war is known to her crewmen, ran into a hornet's nest of Jap suicide pilots.

Scores of the Kamikaze planes were shot down outside the task force formation, but at least four came close enough to be splash-
ætpo pue sup jo sunš epj šq pš ships. Alabama gunners claim credit for downing two of these planes and for assisting in destroying another.

One Kamikaze, a "Zeke"-type fighter, flew through clouds of ack-ack before singling out this ship as his target, but as he turned to make his death run his plane was hit and crashed flaming a scant 300 yards away.

During her bombardment assignment, the Alabama turned loose her 5- and 16-inch guns to pulverize Jap shore installations. The typhoon the battleship experienced pounded the 35,000 ton vessel for hours, causing her to pitch and toss heavily, but she came through undamaged.
