\$20,000 State Tax Fund to Local Schools

\$20,000 has been received by School District 5 from the State Income Tax Fund to offset local property taxes. An equal amount will come to the Ashland School in six months.

The Oregon School Board Association is working on legislation to make permanent this relief for property tax payers. With out this money from the State Income Tax Fund school tax in Ashland would have been about 13 mills higher this year.
