## SOC Enrollment Is Rapidly Increasing

Final enrollment figures for the first summer session shows the Southern Oregon College leading in percentage of increase over the other two colleges of education in Oregon. Its enrollment of 222 is twice as great as that of the Eastern College.

Monmouth has 332 students; this figure represents only a 42.5 % increase in enrollment over the corresponding period of a year ago. Whereas the accumulative enrollment figure for the full summer at SOC is expected to exceed 350.

The second summer session, starts on July 22.

The post session two-week workshop will be held from September 2 to September 14. This workshop is designed to assist people renew or secure emergency certificates to teach in the elementary schools of the state.
