Hospital Policy Of Payments Is **Now In Advance**

HIGH OPERATING COSTS CAUSE CHANGE SAYS MGR.

Patients entering the Ashland Community hospital will henceforth have to pay one week's cost in advance, according to Robert Lugar, manager of the institution, This policy is in line with methods of hospital operation throughout the nation, Lugar pointed out. Medford's Community and Sacred Heart hospitals are inaugurating the same policy March 1.

The move has been found necessary by the hospitals because of the large number of unpaid,

Lugar stated that a determined effort will be made immediately to collect unpaid bills which would aid in meeting the operating costs of the institution.
