HOUSE OF DAVID BALL CLUB MEETS GLOBE TROTTERS JULY 4

One of the highlights of the Fourth of July celebration in Ashland will be the baseball game between the House of David, famed whiskered team from Benton Harbor, Mich., and the Harlem Globetrotters, nationally known colored team from Chicago.

William Healy, secretary of the chamber of commerce, said that a fence would be constructed around Fuller field, site of the game, before July 4 and has pledged 2,000 seats to accommodate the large crowd which is expected. A portion of the gate receipts will go to the Ashland Elks baseball club, Healy said. Starting time of the game has been set for 4:30 p.m. to enable fans to attend the rodeo in the afternoon.

Although several teams travel around the country using the name of the House of David the team which will meet the Globetrotters here is the original team from the colony founded by Mary Purcell. It is the only white team traveling nationwide.

Doc Tally, originator of the famed pepper ball game, is still with the club and will take part in the pepper ball exhibition here. Tally is 53 years old and even yet occasionally pitches a game for the Davids.

Although the Harlem Globetrotters basketball team is probably better known than their baseball aggregation, their diamond nine is one of the most feared among the Negro traveling teams. Like the Davids, their

wins far outnumber their losses each year and they draw capacity crowds wherever they play.

Tickets went on sale Saturday at the Ashland sporting goods store and at Harry Clipman's newsstand.
