The Phoenix Cold Storage Plant to Open August 1

Phoenix, July 24—August 1, the Phoenix Cold Storage Plant, a \$20,000 structure, will be officially open for business. The plant under construction since the fall of 1946 has been undergoing final phases of completion during the past week.

The 67 x 37 foot structure houses a main locker room, cutting room, cooler room, office, two utility rooms and engine room. 800 single and double lockers will be available for rent. According to Caldwell the single lockers will rent for \$12.00 per year and the doubles will rent for \$24.00 per year. Caldwell stated that due to the large cost of the structure that rentals will be paid in advance.
