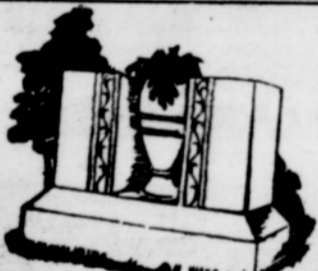

Here's The Stories Behind The New Teachers In The Schools

MARLEN YODER . . . University of Oregon graduate, who will teach mathematics and social science at the Senior high, is a basketball letterman from Alma College, Michigan. He'll coach the high school second string. He has taken work at Stanford University and last year did graduate work at Eugene. He is married and has a small son who is a year old.

GILES S. GREEN who has been living in Ashland for the past year will have charge of the library. Mr. Green has taught library science both on the high school and college level. He comes to Ashland with strong recommendations from Sandpoint and Preston, Idaho where he formerly taught. He will also have classes in mathematics and English at the high school here.

MAXINE JEWELL STEPHEN, a graduate of O.S.C., who has been teaching homemaking at Red Bluff, California, will teach Junior High homemaking. She has also taught at Modesto, and at Seaside Oregon. Mrs. Stephens became available when she moved to Jackson county this summer.

MISS NAN M. CAHILL, who received her degree this year from the University of Oregon will handle the physical education work at the Junior High. A graduate of Astoria High school, Miss Cahill attended the College of Education at Monmouth where she was president of her class. She taught at Milton Oregon and had charge of the City Play Ground at Astoria. She has taken special work in reading and will also teach classes in English.

CHESTER C. SQUIRE will be principal of the Washington school. He holds a degree from Southern Oregon college and has taken work at the University of Oregon and at Greeley, Colorado. His teaching experience was gained in Lake and Klamath counties. He spent four years in the army as an administrative inspector, coming out with the railroad tracks of a captain.

DAVID BARKER who will teach sixth grade at Washington, is another Ashland school's product. Barker finished his work for a degree this summer at Southern Oregon College. Last year he taught in Grants Pass where he had classes in mathematics, physical education and social science. From 1942 to 1945 he was

in the army in the medical detachment of the 37th Inf. Division. He was discharged as a Staff Sergeant after having served two and a half years in the Pacific.

MISS AILENE INLOW will teach the upper grades at Washington. She comes from Roseburg where she taught in the Junior high. Miss Inlow has also taught in Cottage Grove and in Jackson county. She received her education in Ashland and holds a degree from Southern Oregon College.

ELAINE SCHAEFER is returning to the Junior High staff after a years leave of absence. Mrs. Schaefer will teach art and science as well as act as advisor for the Junior High paper. She previously taught in Ashland for a year and a half beginning with the middle of the year 1944-45.

MISS VELMA CRESS is joining the Lincoln school staff where she will have charge of a section of first graders. Miss Cress has held a similar position at Eastern Oregon College of Education. She holds a Masters degree from the University of Southern California. Miss Cress is a member of Alpha Psi Sigma, honorary in scholarship. Miss Cress has also acted as Field Director of the American Red Cross.

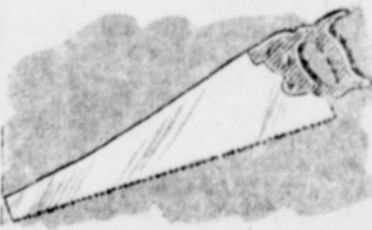

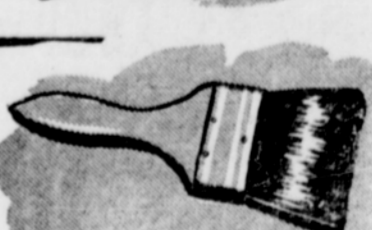
