Apples Need DDT For Codling Moth

C. B. Cordy, county agent for horticulture announced this week that according to tests taken by his department it appeared that apples should be sprayed again for codling moth control. Cordy stated that 1 lb. 50% DDT to 100 gallons of water would suffice, and that it should be completed as soon as possible.

Winter Nelsis should be sprayed with Zerlate or Kar Bam White sometime within the next 10 days. Use 1 1/2 lbs per 100 gallons.

Cordy also pointed out that in order to control peach root borers in all stone fruits and trees should be treated during the next two weeks with paradichlobenzene crystals. He said that the soil should not be disturbed but that grass and trash should be removed from the base of the tree. The crystals should then be placed in a circle about the trunk and from two to four inches from it. They should then be covered with from four to six inches of soil.

In order to be effective this treatment must be completed when the soil is dry and the temperature above 60 degrees F.

For trees 2 to 3 years old use 1/2 oz per tree; for trees 4 to 10 years old use 3/4 oz per tree. For older trees use 1 oz per tree. If the trunks are exceptionally large use 1 1/4 oz per tree.
