And declaring any and all such claims to be null and void, and declaring that the said Plaintiff is the owner in fee simple of said premises, and of the whole thereof, free and clear of any and all right, title, estate, lien or interest of said Defendants, or any of them, and that each and all of the Defendants herein, and each and all of them, be forever enjoined, restrained and barred from asserting, attempting to establish, or claiming any right, title, estate, lien or interest in or to said property, or any portion thereof, and that Plaintiff's title to said premises be forever quieted and set at rest.

The date of the Order for publication of this Summons is the 18th day of September, 1947, and the time prescribed for publication of this Summons is once each week for four consecutive weeks.
