### Phoenix to Have New Trailer Court

Phoenix, Sept. 25—Phoenix will soon boast one of Oregon's finest trailer parks when the Campbell Trailer Park and Sales is completed on the South Pacific Highway. According to Don Campbell, owner, \$25,000 is being invested in the site and accommodations and another \$10,000 in stock of new Trallercraft and Traveler trailers for sales display.

The acre of ground presently being converted to a park site will provide space for 25 trailers and allowing about one-third more space per trailer than is customarily provided.

An 18 by 34 pumice building is being erected to house lavatories, showers and laundry facilities. One room of the building will provide a grocery department for guests of the camp and residents of south Phoenix and vicinity.

The home on the property formerly owned by Mr. and Mrs. Jack Lortner is undergoing extensive remodeling. Completion of the project is expected early this fall.
