Barely by the time it is as the Irishman puts it: "any man is just as good as another, if not better", and in this case those of the Jewish religion; those with an accent not "100% American", and those whose skin contains an excessive amount of pigment, are not being classed with the human race, and Mrs. Hobson, along with, I hope, several million other people, fails to concur.

Perhaps no one book will ever crack the shell of complacency of those who have not suffered ostracism and insult simply because they did not conform to what a few bigots consider the normal power to all those like Laura Hobson and Sinclair Lewis. Timber Sale Date Set For October 16

Sale of 65,000,000 ft of timber on the Klamath Indian Reservation appraised at approximately \$1,200,000 has been scheduled for October 16 at Klamath Agency, Oregon. Col. E. Morgan Pryse, western regional director for the U. S. Indian Service has announced the sale will follow by 28 days the opening of bids on approximately 110,000,000 feet on the little Yamsay unit No. 1 on the Klamath Reservation, which brought a record offer of \$20.51 per 1000 feet for pine. Total bid for the Yamsay timber approximated \$2,300,000.
