Leaders Needed For Brownie Girl Scouts

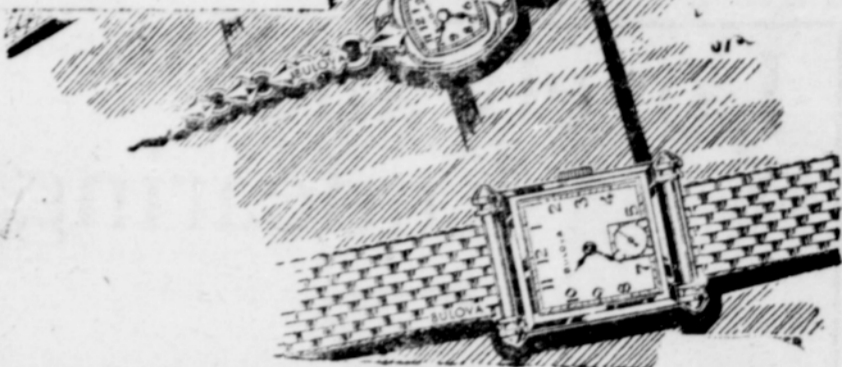
