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SOC "Little Giant" In Sports Records

Southern Oregon College, a comparative midget among the athletic giants of the country, has gained its share of the national spotlight in the years past and promises to hold that prominence in seasons to come. The long list of famous players and coaches who have emerged from the Ashland institution, is sport history and well known to most fans, along with the enviable string of records and titles captured by SOC teams.

Perhaps the brightest chapter in the college's athletic annals has been written since the recent revival of the sports program in 1946, with promise of still greater achievement by SOC athletes yet to come.

In the past two seasons, the Simpson "dynasty" has produced a pair of boys that, if present plans develop, will carry their own name and that of their alma mater to the front pages of the nation's sport sections. Both have played at least two seasons at Southern Oregon, covering all three major sports. One has signed to play professional baseball, the other professional football.

The first, Jack Lutz, hit the headlines recently when he signed a contract with the St. Louis Cardinals of the National League. He will be sent to one of the Cards' farm teams this season, probably in the California League, handling either outfield or pitching duties. Jack is a graduate of Grants Pass high, where he was a three-letter athlete. He played two years of football at SOC, also competing in baseball and basketball. "The Redhead" is 20 years old, married and father of a baby girl.

The other, Chuck DeAutremont, goes into big-time pro football this fall, playing with the Los Angeles Rams of the National League. Chuck is from Eugene where he was an all-around athlete at University High. He has played four years of basketball at SOC, two years of baseball and two of football. Last season from his left-half spot on the Red Raider grid machine, he won all-conference, "little" All-American, and All-American honors. He was tabbed as one of the best halfbacks on the west coast. Chuck is 26 years old this year, having served with the navy during the war. He is married, and has three children—two daughters and a son.

These two SOC products, Lutz and DeAutremont, are the latest on the long list of famous athletes to represent the school, probably to be followed by many more who will carry on the name of the college in the world of sports. And these two, continuing at their present rate, will be two of the brightest names on that list of athletic accomplishment.

He is a substantial taxpayer by reason of real estate holdings and ownership of Fluhrer's Bakeries which began business in Medford 26 years ago with but two employees. Out of this small beginning has grown the present group of modern bakery plants serving Southern Oregon and Northern California.

As an enlisted man in World War I and an Air Force officer in World War II he is vitally interested in the rehabilitation and welfare of service men. He presently commands Southern Oregon's Unit of the U. S. Air Force Reserve.

Fluhrer is a YMCA director, Mason, Shriner, Rotarian, Elk, Legionnaire, VFW member, Lutheran, a life long republican, president of First Federal Savings Loan Association, director White City Lumber Company and stockholder Medford Corporation.

We feel "Heine" Fluhrer would be an ideal senatorial representative from Jackson County because he has actively worked for this section of the state for many years, has demonstrated outstanding business ability and would insist on efficient operation of state government. He has never sought public office before and has the integrity and ability to demand consideration of state problems without regard to special interests.

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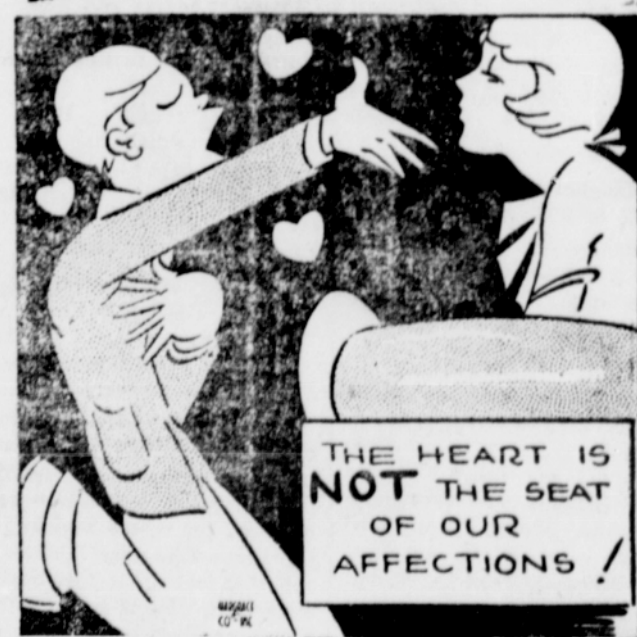
