### Cordy Warns Against Spider Mite Injury

Spider mite are now building up rapidly, especially on Anjou, according to C. B. Cordy, county agent. Very little injury has appeared as yet, but it will

appear in a few days. In many cases the presence of mites is most easily detected by looking for webbing on the upper surface of the leaf. This is a new habit of the mite.

A spray should be applied before much webbing occurs. Use 3/4 lb. of DN-111 plus 1/4 lb. Z-1 per 100 gallons. In speed spray-

ers, 1 lb. DN-111 per 100 gallons and 400 gallons per acre is suggested. This material will burn if the weather is hot (95 degrees F.) If codling moth control is desired add 1 lb. 50% DDT.
